Destinations of pupils aged 16 and 18 (2015)

Five other students stayed at school for an extra year to improve A-level results and all five gained places at good universities.

There are 130 confirmed university places for Autumn 2015, the most common destinations being: 25 at colleges of London University (7 of them at UCL, 6 at KCL and 5 at Imperial), 11 at colleges of Cambridge and Oxford Universities, 12 at Southampton, 10 at Exeter and 7 at Bristol. 11 have places at medical and dental schools and 5 for law.

In the first instance, the Heads of Year attempt to resolve the underlying problems.

Some Highlights of the Year (2014-15)

- Year 10 boy is one of the 20 finalists worldwide in the 2015 Google Prize (first prize \$50,000) for his work in identifying early-onset Alzheimers Disease. He won the Scientific American Prize (\$25,000).
- Three year 9 boys runners-up in Nesta Longitude Prize winning £5,000.
- Year 12/13 team win 3rd prize in UK Engineer of the Year (2015) for design and construction of submersible vehicle.
- Year 9 boy runner up in UK Young Scientist of the Year (2015) for his work on heavy metal poisoning.
- Year 7 boy wins Gold medal and Prize in the UK Junior Maths Olympiad
Two other medals - Y7 and Y8
- Year 9 boy wins medal and prize in the UK Intermediate Maths Olympiad
One other medal - Y9
- Year 13 boy scores 100% in 2015 UK Senior Maths Challenge
- Year 12/13 boys win Gold Medals in the Physics and Chemistry Olympiads
- Year 11 boy one of 4 young people in the country to score 100% in the AQA further maths exam from 26,500 candidates.
- Year 13 student is in the National Youth Orchestra (trumpet soloist)
- Year 8 boy is in the National Children's Orchestra (also trumpet)
- Year 8 boy sponsored by Royal Ballet at the White House School after successes in dancing competitions
- High quality journals produced by students of history (Retrospect), biology (Life), geography (Latitude 51)
- Sport - excellent sports' ground (27 acres) - e.g. football: two teams per year group most Saturdays
- Cricket vs MCC (SGS first state school to host matches against the MCC)
- National champions and UK squad members in Judo(2), Triathlon, Biathlon, and Biathle.
- Four finalists in the last two years in the Apps for Good competition (45,000 entrants per year).
- Boys prepared well for university and working life - e.g. 130 places at university confirmed for Autumn 2015 including 11 for medicine and dentistry, 11 at Oxford and Cambridge colleges (for English, geography, history, medicine, engineering, physics, law, economics, Chinese).
- New buildings (ready for September 2015) include a three storey building with new facilities for geography, art and a whole floor for the sixth form. The J.R Taylor Music Trust have funded a new music room with recording facilities for the expansion of music-making at the school.
- CCF celebrates 100 years of existence with building new memorial cairn for those who have served in the armed forces and died on active service from WW2 to present day.
